

Types of Sentences

1 Declarative Sentences



Definition

Declarative sentences are used to share information, ideas, facts, opinions, or explain something.

Uses

- Give information
- State facts
- Express opinions
- Tell or explain something

Examples

- I completed my homework.
- The sun rises in the east.
- She likes to read books.

2 Interrogative Sentences



Definition

Interrogative sentences are used to ask questions, get information, or check understanding.

Uses

- Ask questions
- Get information
- Check understanding
- Start a conversation

Examples

- Where do you live?
- Did you call your teacher?
- Can you help me?

3 Imperative Sentences



Definition

Imperative sentences are used to give commands, instructions, advice, warnings, or requests.

Uses

- Give commands
- Give instructions
- Give advice
- Make requests
- Give warnings

Examples

- Please close the door.
- Turn off the lights.
- Be careful while crossing the road.
- Pass me the book.

4 Exclamatory Sentences



Definition

Exclamatory sentences are used to express strong feelings or sudden emotions such as surprise, joy, anger, or excitement.

Uses

- Express strong emotions
- Show excitement
- Show surprise
- Express admiration or amazement

Examples

- What a beautiful view!
- How amazing you are!
- I can't believe we won!
- What a delicious meal!



Examples of Types of Sentences

1 DECLARATIVE SENTENCES



Used to give information or share ideas.

Examples:

- I live near the city center.
- My mother cooks delicious food.
- The meeting starts at nine o'clock.
- They watched a movie last night.
- English grammar becomes easier with practice.
- Sara enjoys reading historical novels.
- The children are playing outside.

2 INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES



Used to ask questions or get information.

Examples:

- What time does the class begin?
- Did you call your friend yesterday?
- Where is my notebook?
- Are they ready for the exam?
- Why did the baby cry?
- Can you help me with this exercise?
- How often do you practice speaking English?

3 IMPERATIVE SENTENCES



Used to give commands, instructions, advice, or requests.

Examples:

- Please send me the document.
- Turn off the lights before leaving.
- Do your homework carefully.
- Don't speak during the presentation.
- Take this medicine after dinner.
- Wait here for a few minutes.
- Help your younger brother with his project.

4 EXCLAMATORY SENTENCES



Used to express strong feelings or emotions.

Examples:

- What an amazing performance!
- How beautiful the sky looks tonight!
- I can't believe we won!
- That was such a scary moment!
- What a wonderful surprise!
- How fast the car was moving!
- This cake tastes fantastic!
