Write one new sentence of your own.

Review

Return after one day, three days, and one week.

Verb

Basic: Admit

MEANING

Admit or show that something is known

EXAMPLE*Lina acknowledged her mistake and corrected it.***Cautious**

0006

Adjective

Basic: Careful

MEANING

Careful to avoid danger or mistakes

EXAMPLE*Amir was cautious near the wet floor.***Anticipate**

Verb

Basic: Expect

MEANING

Expect something before it happens

EXAMPLE*We anticipate rain after lunch.***Convenient**

0007

Adjective

Basic: Handy

MEANING

Easy and useful for your needs

EXAMPLE*The bus stop is convenient for students.***Apparent**

0003

Adjective

Basic: Clear

MEANING

Easy to notice or understand

EXAMPLE*Her excitement was apparent from her smile.***Deliberate**

Adjective

Basic: Planned

MEANING

Planned or done intentionally

EXAMPLE*His slow movement was deliberate.***Appropriate**

Basic: Suitable

MEANING

Suitable for a situation

EXAMPLE*Wear appropriate shoes for the hike.***Eager**

Basic: Keen

MEANING

Very interested and ready

EXAMPLE*The children were eager to begin.***Brief**

Adjective

Basic: Short

MEANING

Lasting only a short time

EXAMPLE*We had a brief meeting before class.***Efficient**

Basic: Effective

MEANING

Working well without wasting time

EXAMPLE*This method is quick and efficient.*

Encounter

Verb

Basic: Meet

MEANING

Meet or experience unexpectedly

EXAMPLE*We encountered heavy traffic on the way.***Gradual**

0016

Adjective

Basic: Slow

MEANING

Happening slowly over time

EXAMPLE*His reading showed gradual improvement.***Evident**

0012

Adjective

Basic: Obvious

MEANING

Clearly seen or understood

EXAMPLE*Her improvement was evident in the test.***Immediate**

Adjective

Basic: Instant

MEANING

Happening without delay

EXAMPLE*The cut needed immediate attention.***Exceptional**

0013

Adjective

Basic: Excellent

MEANING

Unusually good or impressive

EXAMPLE*Maya gave an exceptional performance.***Inevitable**

Adjective

Basic: Unavoidable

MEANING

Certain to happen

EXAMPLE*Some mistakes are inevitable while learning.***Flexible**

Adjective

Basic: Adaptable

MEANING

Able to change when needed

EXAMPLE*Our study plan is flexible.***Maintain**

Verb

Basic: Keep

MEANING

Keep something in good condition

EXAMPLE*We maintain the garden every weekend.***Frequent**

Adjective

Basic: Regular

MEANING

Happening often

EXAMPLE*Frequent practice improves pronunciation.***Modify**

0020

Verb

Basic: Change

MEANING

Change something slightly

EXAMPLE*You can modify the plan later.*

Noticeable

0021

Adjective

Basic: Clear

MEANING

Easy to see or recognize

EXAMPLE*There was a noticeable change in her voice.***Prefer**

Verb

Basic: Favor

MEANING

Like one choice more than another

EXAMPLE*I prefer reading before bedtime.***Obtain**

0022

Verb

Basic: Get

MEANING

Get something through effort

EXAMPLE*Students can obtain books from the library.***Prevent**

0027

Verb

Basic: Stop

MEANING

Stop something from happening

EXAMPLE*Helmets help prevent head injuries.***Ordinary**

0023

Adjective

Basic: Normal

MEANING

Normal and not unusual

EXAMPLE*It looked like an ordinary box.***Proceed**

0028

Verb

Basic: Continue

MEANING

Continue or move forward

EXAMPLE*Please proceed to the next question.***Particular**

0024

Adjective

Basic: Specific

MEANING

Specific rather than general

EXAMPLE*I need a particular type of paper.***Prompt**

0029

Adjective

Basic: Quick

MEANING

Done without unnecessary delay

EXAMPLE*Thank you for your prompt reply.***Practical**

0025

Adjective

Basic: Useful

MEANING

Useful and sensible

EXAMPLE*Her suggestion was practical and affordable.***Reasonable**

0030

Adjective

Basic: Fair

MEANING

Fair, sensible, or acceptable

EXAMPLE*The teacher gave us a reasonable deadline.*

Recommend

Verb

Basic: Suggest

MEANING

Suggest something as a good choice

EXAMPLE*I recommend this book for young readers.***Scarce**

0036

Adjective

Basic: Rare

MEANING

Difficult to find or obtain

EXAMPLE*Clean water was scarce during the drought.***Reluctant**

0032

Adjective

Basic: Unwilling

MEANING

Unwilling or unsure about doing something

EXAMPLE*Noah was reluctant to speak first.***Select**

0037

Verb

Basic: Choose

MEANING

Choose from several options

EXAMPLE*Select one answer from the list.***Request**

0033

Verb

Basic: Ask

MEANING

Ask for something politely

EXAMPLE*She requested more time for the task.***Significant**

0038

Adjective

Basic: Important

MEANING

Important or large enough to notice

EXAMPLE*The team made significant progress.***Require**

0034

Verb

Basic: Need

MEANING

Need something for a purpose

EXAMPLE*The activity requires scissors and glue.***Sufficient**

0039

Adjective

Basic: Enough

MEANING

As much as is needed

EXAMPLE*We have sufficient food for everyone.***Respond**

0035

Verb

Basic: Reply

MEANING

Answer or react to something

EXAMPLE*Please respond before Friday.***Suitable**

0040

Adjective

Basic: Right

MEANING

Right for a person or purpose

EXAMPLE*This story is suitable for younger students.*

Temporary

0041

Adjective

Basic: Short-term

MEANING

Lasting for a limited time

EXAMPLE*The road closure is temporary.***Verify**

0046

Verb

Basic: Check

MEANING

Check that something is correct

EXAMPLE*Verify the answer before submitting it.***Tolerate**

0042

Verb

Basic: Endure

MEANING

Accept something unpleasant without reacting strongly

EXAMPLE*I cannot tolerate very loud music.***Willing**

0047

Adjective

Basic: Ready

MEANING

Ready to do something

EXAMPLE*Zara was willing to help her classmate.***Typical**

0043

Adjective

Basic: Usual

MEANING

Normal for a person or group

EXAMPLE*Rain is typical here in winter.***Withdraw**

0048

Verb

Basic: Remove

MEANING

Remove or move away

EXAMPLE*He decided to withdraw his application.***Urgent**

0044

Adjective

Basic: Pressing

MEANING

Needing quick attention

EXAMPLE*The message was marked urgent.***Accessible**

0049

Adjective

Basic: Available

MEANING

Easy to reach, use, or understand

EXAMPLE*The website is accessible on mobile phones.***Valuable**

0045

Adjective

Basic: Useful

MEANING

Useful, important, or worth much

EXAMPLE*Her advice was valuable to the team.***Affordable**

Adjective

Basic: Inexpensive

MEANING

Not too expensive

EXAMPLE*We found an affordable school bag.*

Find an answer using numbers

EXAMPLE*Calculate the total cost of the books.***Accomplish**

Basic: Complete

MEANING

Successfully finish something

EXAMPLE*We accomplished every task before lunch.***Collaborate**

0057

Verb

Basic: Cooperate

MEANING

Work with other people

EXAMPLE*The students collaborated on a poster.***Accurate**

0053

Adjective

Basic: Correct

MEANING

Correct and free from mistakes

EXAMPLE*His calculation was accurate.***Comprehend**

0058

Verb

Basic: Understand

MEANING

Fully understand something

EXAMPLE*She could comprehend the difficult paragraph.***Assignment**

0054

Noun

Basic: Task

MEANING

A piece of schoolwork

EXAMPLE*Our science assignment is due Monday.***Concentrate**

0059

Verb

Basic: Focus

MEANING

Give full attention to something

EXAMPLE*Please concentrate on the instructions.***Attentive**

0055

Adjective

Basic: Focused

MEANING

Listening or watching carefully

EXAMPLE*The class remained attentive during the lesson.***Conduct**

0060

Verb

Basic: Carry out

MEANING

Organize or carry out an activity

EXAMPLE*The class conducted a science experiment.*

Contribute

0061

Verb

Basic: Add

MEANING

Give ideas, effort, or resources

EXAMPLE*Everyone contributed an idea.***Evaluate**

0066

Verb

Basic: Assess

MEANING

Judge quality or progress carefully

EXAMPLE*The teacher evaluated our presentations.***Demonstrate**

Basic: Show

MEANING

Show how something works

EXAMPLE*The teacher demonstrated the new method.***Examination**

0067

Noun

Basic: Test

MEANING

A formal test of knowledge

EXAMPLE*Her mathematics examination begins tomorrow.***Discipline**

Noun

Basic: Control

MEANING

Controlled and responsible behavior

EXAMPLE*Good discipline helps the class learn.***Feedback**

0068

Noun

Basic: Comments

MEANING

Comments that help someone improve

EXAMPLE*The teacher gave helpful feedback.***Discuss**

0064

Verb

Basic: Talk about

MEANING

Talk about a subject together

EXAMPLE*We discussed the story's ending.***Formulate**

0069

Verb

Basic: Develop

MEANING

Develop an idea or plan carefully

EXAMPLE*We formulated a plan for the project.***Educate**

Verb

Basic: Teach

MEANING

Teach or provide knowledge

EXAMPLE*Museums educate visitors about history.***Instruct**

Basic: Direct

MEANING

Tell or teach someone what to do

EXAMPLE*The coach instructed us to warm up.*

Interpret

Basic: Explain

MEANING

Explain the meaning of something

EXAMPLE*Students interpreted the poem differently.***Participate**

Basic: Join

MEANING

Take part in an activity

EXAMPLE*Everyone participated in the discussion.***Knowledge**

Basic: Understanding

MEANING

Information and understanding

EXAMPLE*Reading increases your knowledge.***Perform**

Basic: Present

MEANING

Carry out an activity or present something

EXAMPLE*The group performed a short play.***Lecture**

Basic: Talk

MEANING

A formal educational talk

EXAMPLE*We attended a lecture about space.***Presentation**

Basic: Talk

MEANING

A talk given to an audience

EXAMPLE*Her presentation included clear pictures.***Memorize**

Basic: Learn

MEANING

Learn something so you can remember it

EXAMPLE*Memorize the first four lines.***Progress**

Basic: Improvement

MEANING

Improvement over time

EXAMPLE*You have made excellent progress.***Objective**

Basic: Goal

MEANING

A result you want to achieve

EXAMPLE*Our objective is to finish the model.***Revise**

MEANING

Study something again before a test

EXAMPLE*I revised my notes after dinner.*

Schedule

Basic: Timetable

MEANING

A plan showing times and activities

EXAMPLE*Check tomorrow's class schedule.***Summarize**

Basic: Shorten

MEANING

Give the main points briefly

EXAMPLE*Summarize the chapter in five sentences.***Solve**

Basic: Answer

MEANING

Find the answer to a problem

EXAMPLE*Can you solve this puzzle?***Task**

Noun

Basic: Job

MEANING

A piece of work to complete

EXAMPLE*The first task was easy.***Standard**

0083

Noun

Basic: Level

MEANING

An expected level of quality

EXAMPLE*Her work met the required standard.***Technique**

0088

Noun

Basic: Method

MEANING

A particular way of doing something

EXAMPLE*This drawing technique uses light lines.***Strategy**

Noun

Basic: Plan

MEANING

A planned way to achieve something

EXAMPLE*Our reading strategy saved time.***Topic**

0089

Noun

Basic: Subject

MEANING

The subject being discussed or studied

EXAMPLE*Today's topic is renewable energy.***Submit**

Basic: Hand in

MEANING

Give work to a teacher or authority

EXAMPLE*Submit your homework before noon.***Worksheet**

Basic: Exercise sheet

MEANING

A page containing learning activities

EXAMPLE*Complete the vocabulary worksheet.*

Achieve

Basic: Reach

MEANING

Reach a goal through effort

EXAMPLE*She achieved a high score.***Prepare**

Basic: Get ready

MEANING

Get ready for something

EXAMPLE*We prepared for the spelling test.***Compare**

MEANING

Examine similarities and differences

EXAMPLE*Compare the two characters.***Recite**

Basic: Repeat

MEANING

Say something aloud from memory

EXAMPLE*He recited the poem confidently.***Complete**

MEANING

Finish every part of something

EXAMPLE*Complete the sentences before class ends.***Research**

MEANING

Careful study to discover information

EXAMPLE*Our research focused on sea animals.***Improve**

Make or become better

EXAMPLE*Daily reading can improve fluency.***Review**

Look at something again

EXAMPLE*Review your answers before leaving.***Organize**

Arrange things in a clear order

EXAMPLE*Organize your notes by topic.***Study**

EXAMPLE

He absorbed the lesson quickly.

Categorize

MEANING

Place things into groups

EXAMPLE

Categorize the animals by habitat.

Assess

Verb

Basic: Evaluate

MEANING

Judge something carefully

EXAMPLE

Assess your work before submitting it.

Contemplate

0107

Verb

Basic: Consider

MEANING

Think carefully for a long time

EXAMPLE

She contemplated both choices.

Assume

0103

Verb

Basic: Suppose

MEANING

Believe something without complete proof

EXAMPLE

Do not assume the answer is correct.

Curious

Adjective

Basic: Interested

MEANING

Wanting to know or learn more

EXAMPLE

The curious child asked many questions.

Awareness

Basic: Knowledge

MEANING

Knowledge that something exists

EXAMPLE

The campaign raised awareness about recycling.

Deduce

Basic: Work out

MEANING

Reach an answer using known facts

EXAMPLE

We deduced that the door was locked.

Brainstorm

Basic: Think up

MEANING

Produce many ideas quickly

EXAMPLE

We brainstormed names for the club.

Determine

Basic: Decide

MEANING

Discover or decide something

EXAMPLE

The test will determine the winner.

Differentiate

Basic: Distinguish

MEANING

Recognize differences between things

EXAMPLE

Can you differentiate fact from opinion?

Grasp

Basic: Understand

MEANING

Understand an idea

EXAMPLE

Mia quickly grasped the new rule.

Estimate

Verb

Basic: Guess

MEANING

Make a close guess about an amount

EXAMPLE

Estimate how many beans are inside.

Identify

Basic: Recognize

MEANING

Recognize and name something

EXAMPLE

Identify the main character.

Examine

Basic: Inspect

MEANING

Look at something very carefully

EXAMPLE

Examine the picture for hidden details.

Imagine

MEANING

Form a picture or idea in your mind

EXAMPLE

Imagine living on another planet.

Explore

MEANING

Study or investigate something new

EXAMPLE

We explored several possible answers.

Infer

MEANING

Form an opinion from clues

EXAMPLE

We inferred that the character was afraid.

Focus

MEANING

Direct attention toward one thing

EXAMPLE

Focus on the speaker's main point.

Inquire

MEANING

Ask for information

EXAMPLE

I inquired about the library hours.

Insight

Basic: Understanding

MEANING

A clear understanding of something

EXAMPLE

The interview gave us insight into her work.

Recall

Basic: Remember

MEANING

Bring a fact back into your mind

EXAMPLE

I could not recall his name.

Logical

Basic: Sensible

MEANING

Based on clear and sensible reasoning

EXAMPLE

His explanation was logical.

Recognize

Verb

Basic: Identify

MEANING

Know something because you saw it before

EXAMPLE

I recognized the song immediately.

Perceive

0123

Verb

Basic: Notice

MEANING

Notice or understand something

EXAMPLE

She perceived a change in his tone.

Reflect

Verb

Basic: Think

MEANING

Think carefully about an experience

EXAMPLE

Reflect on what you learned today.

Predict

Basic: Forecast

MEANING

Say what may happen in the future

EXAMPLE

Predict what will happen next.

Remember

Basic: Recall

MEANING

Keep or bring information to mind

EXAMPLE

Remember to bring your notebook.

Question

MEANING

Express doubt or ask for an explanation

EXAMPLE

She questioned the unusual result.

Retain

MEANING

Continue to remember information

EXAMPLE

Pictures help learners retain new words.

Reason

MEANING

Think in a clear, sensible way

EXAMPLE

She reasoned that both answers were possible.

Wonder

Basic: Ask yourself

MEANING

Think curiously about something

EXAMPLE

I wonder why the leaves changed color.

Speculate

Basic: Guess

MEANING

Guess without having all the facts

EXAMPLE

We speculated about the surprise guest.

Discover

Basic: Find

MEANING

Find something previously unknown

EXAMPLE

Scientists discovered a new species.

Suppose

Basic: Assume

MEANING

Think something is probably true

EXAMPLE

I suppose the shop is closed.

Analyze

Basic: Examine

MEANING

Study something by examining its parts

EXAMPLE

Analyze the writer's main argument.

Trace

Basic: Follow

MEANING

Follow the development or path of something

EXAMPLE

Trace the river on the map.

Classify

MEANING

Arrange things into named groups

EXAMPLE

Classify these rocks by color.

Visualize

MEANING

Create a mental picture

EXAMPLE

Visualize the scene before drawing it.

Connect

MEANING

Recognize a relationship between ideas

EXAMPLE

Connect the cause with its effect.

Consider

MEANING

Think carefully before deciding

EXAMPLE

Consider every option before choosing.

Understand

MEANING

Know the meaning of something

EXAMPLE

I understand the first example.

Investigate

MEANING

Examine something to discover facts

EXAMPLE

The class investigated how plants grow.

Conclude

MEANING

Reach a final opinion from evidence

EXAMPLE

We concluded that the water was unsafe.

Learn

Basic: Study

MEANING

Gain knowledge or a skill

EXAMPLE

We learned three new expressions.

Associate

Basic: Link

MEANING

Connect one thing with another

EXAMPLE

I associate that song with summer.

Notice

MEANING

Become aware of something

EXAMPLE

Did you notice the spelling change?

Synthesize

Basic: Combine

MEANING

Combine ideas into a new whole

EXAMPLE

Synthesize the facts into one paragraph.

Process

MEANING

Understand and deal with information

EXAMPLE

Give her time to process the instructions.

Conceptualize

Basic: Imagine

MEANING

Form a clear idea in your mind

EXAMPLE

She conceptualized the design before drawing it.

Basic: Tell

MEANING

Make information publicly known

EXAMPLE

The principal announced the results.

Communicate

0156

Verb

Basic: Share

MEANING

Share information or feelings

EXAMPLE

Pictures can communicate powerful ideas.

Articulate

0152

Verb

Basic: Explain

MEANING

Express an idea clearly

EXAMPLE

She articulated her opinion confidently.

Complain

0157

Verb

Basic: Protest

MEANING

Express unhappiness about something

EXAMPLE

He complained about the noisy room.

Assert

0153

Verb

Basic: Declare

MEANING

State something firmly

EXAMPLE

He asserted that the answer was correct.

Confess

0158

Verb

Basic: Admit

MEANING

Admit something that was hidden

EXAMPLE

She confessed that she broke the cup.

Assure

Basic: Promise

MEANING

Tell someone something with confidence

EXAMPLE

I assured her that we had enough time.

Convince

Basic: Persuade

MEANING

Make someone believe or agree

EXAMPLE

The evidence convinced the judges.

Comment

Basic: Remark

MEANING

Give an opinion or observation

EXAMPLE

The teacher commented on my handwriting.

Debate

Basic: Discuss

MEANING

Discuss opposing opinions formally
